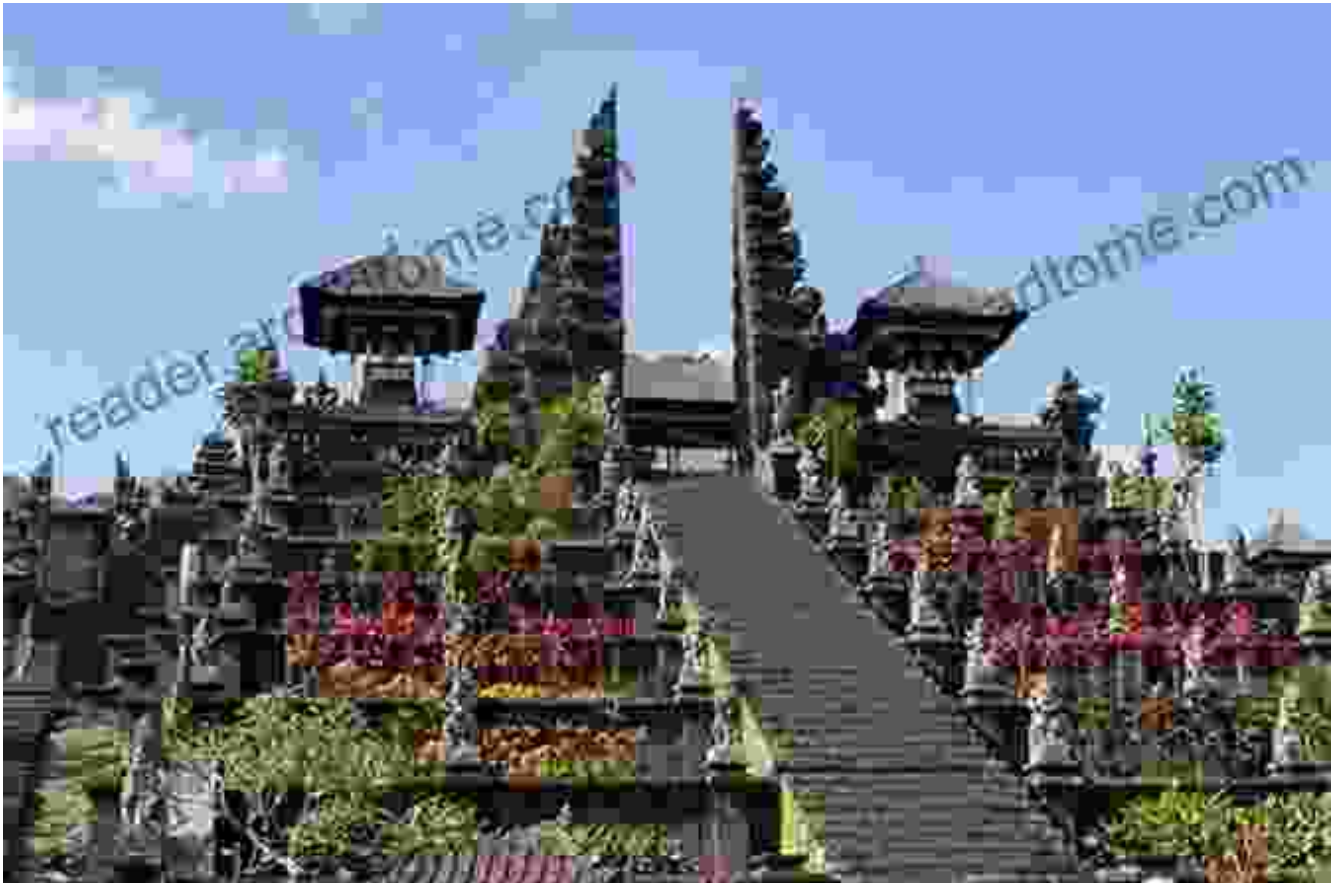


UNESCO World Heritage Sites

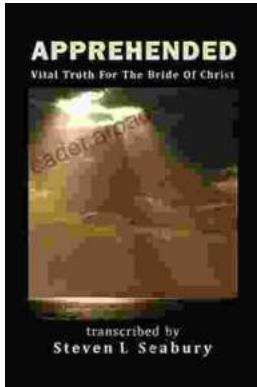
