



5) Revolt of Iran (Persia)  
Umar (R)'s era Yazdigard fled to Turkistan. Tried to create uprising in Iran Abdullah bin Amir (R) marched and won it.

6) Conquest of Tabaristan  
Saeed bin al aas (R) appointed the governor. People rose in revolt. Saeed (R) reconquered it.

7) Conquest of Khurasan, Fakhraistan, Sistan and Kabul  
Abdullah bin Amir (R), Saeed bin al aas (R) marched to Khurasan and conquered it. They besieged the city of Nishapur for a month after which Marzuban, the governor of Nishapur made a truce. Yazdigard was killed and Takharistan, Kirmān, Sistan were conquered. They also reached the borders of India.

8) The battle of Muna (Phoenix, now known as Funik) Naval battle with the Byzantines. 500 fleets of ships Vs 200 muslim fleet. Muslims won Muslims sea power was recognized.






